

## <u>Ashcroft Infant and Nursey School</u> <u>Sports Premium Funding Report</u>

## September 2020

The sports premium grant is given directly to schools, so they have the flexibility to make additional and sustainable improvements that works best for their pupils. Using this funding schools must make additional and sustainability improvement to the quality of physical education, physical activity and sports they provide.

This means that schools should use the PE and sports premium to:

- > Develop or add to PE, physical activity and sport that the school provides
- > Build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years.

Schools use sports premium to secure improvements in the following 5 indicators

- > Engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
- > Raise profile of PE and sport across school
- > Increase confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sports
- > Provide broader experience of a range of sports and activities
- > Increased participation in competitive sport.
