School PE and sport: funding for primary schools

Following the inspiring London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games the Government is determined to secure a significant and lasting legacy by developing an enjoyment of sport, physical activity and promoting a healthy lifestyle in children from an early age.

Every state-funded school in the country with primary-aged pupils will receive additional funding from an overall allocation of £150m per year ring-fenced for sport and physical education (PE). The funding is ring-fenced, and must be spent on sport and Physical Education.

Here at Ashcroft we have audited current provision and produced a development plan which encompasses the following key points:

- To raise staff confidence in the delivery of high quality PE and school sport sessions through quality CPD
- To increase staff awareness of and ability to assess children against the new NC objectives.
- To increase staff awareness and knowledge of differentiation to ensure that all groups are challenged
- · To enable children from across the school to participate in regular inter school sports events
- To create a sustainable improvement to the schools PE provision and be able to account for the use of the money and its impact.
- To enhance outdoor learning and provide further team building opportunities.
- To provide a greater range of sporting opportunities besides the traditional curriculum sports during curriculum time and after school.
- To provide children with some strategies to improve health and wellbeing.
- · To encourage more outdoor play and learning opportunities.
